

Oswayo Valley Title Programs Fact Sheet

Title I, Part A – Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged

Program Description: Title I, Part A is a supplemental education program that provides financial assistance to local educational agencies to improve educational opportunities for educationally needy children. Title I programs are designed to help children meet the state content and performance standards in reading, language arts, and mathematics.

Funding Source: Federal

Eligible Activities: Supplemental educational services for educationally disadvantaged students. Activities must be secular, neutral, and nonideological.

Title II, Part A - Improving Teacher Quality

Program Description: Title II, Part A is a supplemental educational program that provides financial assistance to improve the skills of teachers and other school staff and the quality of instruction in core academic subjects.

Funding Source: Federal

Eligible Activities:

- Improving the knowledge of teachers, principals, and other educational personnel in one or more of the core academic subjects and in effective instructional teaching strategies, methods, and skills;
- Training in effectively integrating technology into curricula and instruction;
- Training in how to teach students with different needs, including students with disabilities or limited English proficiency, and gifted and talented students;
- Training in methods of improving student behavior, identifying early and appropriate interventions, and involving parents more effectively in their children's education;
- Leadership development and management training to improve the quality of principals and superintendents; and
- Training in the use of data and assessments to improve instruction and student outcomes.
- All professional development activities must be secular, neutral, and nonideological.
